

Augusta Picnic Regatta Briefing Notes Saturday 27th January 2024

- There will be 6 races in total one, the first race will commence at 8:00am from the Turner Street Jetty beach finishing at the Yacht Club on the Regatta Race Day Finishing Line immediately adjacent to the Yacht Club boat ramp. A distance according to Google Maps around 3.5 klms & it will be an incoming tide peaking early afternoon.
- There will be 5 short course races all over the same distance over a distance of 500 metres with a turning buoy at the 250-metre mark. (as per last year) Each skiff will have its own turning buoy (clearly marked with its lane number & colour coordinated with starting buoy) Rounding of the buoy will be to Port for all skiffs
- The short course races as they have previously been,
 - o All women's crew
 - o All men's crew
 - Mixed crew
 - Veteran's (over 70 & not gender specific)
 - Marg's Cup

Clubs to have nominations in by 19th January 2024

- All races shall nominally be 30 minutes apart with welcome & briefing commencing at 9:30 am First race of the Short Course programme to start at 10:00 am
- Lane draws will be conducted & posted on the whiteboard located adjacent to the flagpole prior to the commencement of racing. Lane numbering will be from the Yacht Club shoreline.
- The start & finish line will be adjacent to the boat ramp to maximise the beach space for viewing with starter / umpire on the 'official support boat'. Judges will be shore based in line with the finish line. (as per last year)
- All skiffs must have an experienced coxswain in control of the skiff for all races & need not be gender specific where applicable in the interest of safety. Note – life jackets for all crew must at least be carried onboard as per boating regulations
- Prior to the start line there will be buoys marking the marshalling zone where the racing crews are to assemble & row forward in an acceptable line as called by the starter/ umpire
- All skiffs will start free; hence there will be a 'rolling starts to windward' and be accordance with SASI International commands of
 - "All crews; Attention.
 - Go!" with the drop of the arm
- Deliberate 'breaking of the start" when called by the umpire, will result in offending boat having to let all boats clear before doing a 360 degree turn & return to racing.

- Hitting / colliding with the turning buoy will not disqualify a competitor, but the skiff must round the buoy leaving it to port. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
- Results for each race will be recorded on the whiteboard adjacent to the flagpole
- All protests lodged must be accompanied by a carton of wine with the first 6 bottles being for the establishment of the protest committee's substance & should the protest be upheld the remaining 6 bottles must be shared by all!
- Where a club is unable to fill all crew positions let us know & we'll seek rowers from Augusta & other clubs
- Visiting clubs to provide a finish line judge preferably someone who can use the camera on their phone air horn to signal finish.
- Lunch as per last year, sausage sizzle under the paper barks we will be asking for all clubs to collect \$10 per head for lunch and regatta expenses and forward monies to our account by Friday 19th January 2024 for catering purposes. A limited number of latecomers etc will be accommodated for & a donation tin available
